

# Langenbeck-Virchow-Haus Events





#### Overview

Since its completion in 1915, the Langenbeck-Virchow-Haus has been a center for knowledge exchange. Spread over five floors, it offers event spaces for up to 500 participants. The event formats are primarily meetings, congresses, and symposia, but also evening receptions or dinners. The house has approximately 145 m² of net exhibition space in the lower three foyers.


Each room is equipped with at least a projector or a TV screen. The additional equipment varies depending on the room. Wi-Fi is available throughout the house. Upon request, any additional technical equipment (e.g. hybrid, audio, etc.) can be arranged.



## Foyer | Ground Floor



The Historic Foyer on the ground floor is used for exhibitions, receptions, gala dinners, and catering during breaks. It has a permanently installed cloakroom and three counters that can be used for cloakroom services or registration.

#### Expertisium | Ground Floor



The Expertisium, renovated in 2023, offers an exclusive atmosphere for workshops with up to 40 people thanks to its modern, high-quality equipment. Movable walls allow spatial division into three areas, for example, for exclusive catering or interactive workshops. The Expertisium can also be used as an extension of the foyer for catering and/or additional poster exhibitions.



#### Wandelhalle | 1st Floor



The Wandelhalle on the 1st floor is connected with the Foyer at the ground floor by a representative staircase. With its historic ambiance, it provides an inviting setting for smaller receptions, poster presentations, and industrial exhibitions. For events with more than 300 participants, this area is used as additional catering space alongside the ground floor.

#### Bernhard von Langenbeck | 1st Floor



The formerly small lecture hall offers a quiet, historic environment for your event. Seating is provided with the existing furniture according to your specifications. The Bernhard von Langenbeck room is mainly used as a workshop room in connection with larger congresses, as additional exhibition space or as a lecture or plenary room for medium-sized events.





The Foyer on the 2nd floor offers participants access to the parquet area of the Historic Lecture Hall via four doors. The space can also be used for poster or industrial exhibitions.

#### Historic Lecture Hall | 2nd Floor



The listed Historic Lecture Hall has been largely restored to its original state from 1915 during renovation work in 2005. The ceiling frescoes with scenes from Greek mythology have been preserved. There are a total of 500 seats within the parquet and balcony area, providing space for lecture or music events and conferences. The Lecture Hall has extensive video and audio equipment, including the latest media technology for digital formats.

#### Rudolf Virchow | 2nd Floor



The Rudolf Virchow room is the only seminar room that still has original wall paintings. Large coffered windows provide a great view into the green and a pleasant working atmosphere. The room is particularly suitable for medium-sized meetings in U-shaped seating or as a break-out at conferences and congresses.



The former archive rooms in the attic of the Langenbeck-Vichow-Haus were extensively converted into two cosy seminar rooms as part of the complete renovation from 2003 to 2005. They offer the perfect surrounding for smaller meetings, seminars or workshops with an informal character.



#### Robert Koch | 5th Floor



The Robert Koch room is the second largest seminar room in the house after the Bernhard von Langenbeck room. Floor-to-ceiling windows open up a wide view of the government district with the Reichstag dome. It fits perfectly well as a plenary hall for smaller conferences or lectures, but also for larger meetings and training courses.

A particular highlight is the direct access to the rooftop terrace, offering views over the historic buildings of the Charité Campus.
